captik^wł is our oral history that speaks of a time when there were no humans, only animal people. They roamed the land and were very dangerous. In this captik^wł rattlesnake and salmon, it explains how rattlesnakes, wolves and salmon were transformed into what they are today.

Long ago Salmon's home was high atop the Kettle Falls cliff. Salmon was a brave warrior.
